He represents buyers and sellers of properties and business assets involving brownfields and petroleum, environmental concerns including drafting and negotiating contractual language, transfer of permits, and investigation, assessment and response to contamination and other environmental liabilities. Curt has represented a variety of clients and obtained site closures through Indiana's Voluntary Remediation Program—a program he helped create by participating in regulated-industry and legal community work groups—and other state and federal cleanup programs.

Curt received his A.B. from Princeton University in 1982. He received his J.D. from the University of California, Berkeley, School of Law in 1988. Before law school, Curt taught at the Crossroads School for Arts and Sciences in Santa Monica, California. He was an associate at Ice Miller Donadio & Ryan in Indianapolis from 1988 to 1993. He joined this firm in 1993 and became a partner in 1998.
